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Greetings from Goli; a golden place.

Although it was not easy to say goodbye to family and friends in the Netherlands, I knew it was for Gods purpose. (Psalm 126:6)

During my first week in Africa I was in Uganda. Here I was able to attend the first school-day of Joshua. I left Joshua in November 2011 as a weak, sickly, orphan of 4 years old. His improvement within 2 months has been miraculous. It was a blessing to see him going to the school of 'Stichting UP4S' as a strong and curious boy who is enjoying his classmates! (Joshua1:5)

Goli

After an enjoyable journey from Uganda to South Sudan, I arrived safely at the Emmanuel Christian Training Centre (ECTC) in Goli. A very peaceful place. Goli means "Gold" in Zulu-language and "Bringing People Together" in the Mondu language. I realized that God is really using this place to bring people together, when a group of students from the two tribes of the East were praying together for the conflict they have in their homecommunities. It is amazing to ex-

perience that this place is not only bringing people together, but also bringing people (including me) closer to God. (Psalm 91: 1-2). That's worth even more than gold!

Teacher Training

During my first days in Goli I spend some days 'finding my way' and praying for daily guidance in His direction. (I Cor I: 26-31). There is a lot to do related to the training given to the students. I have given already some biblestudies and English writing lessons. Together with a

South Sudanese and Tanzanian colleague I am developing courses whereby we will train the students practical teaching skills and teach them how to reflect on their own behaviour and (teaching) actions.

Outreach Training

The need for education in this country is enormous. We've designed a training (called In-Service) to reach out to the Primary School Teachers who are untrained. Although we don't have enough Financial support

yet, we have the faith that we will start the First Phase of this training during the holiday of the Primary Schools in May 2012.

Tanabor Yunan was walking for two weeks to reach ECTC! His journey started in his home-area Nuba Mountains, an area that is in conflict with (North) Sudan. On his way he slept in holes to protect himself from the bomb-attacks of the Arabs. While the army-leaders of South Sudan advised him not to go because of insecurity, he decided to start walking just the day before Christmas..

Why? The answer is his life-story; When Yunan was a child there were no teachers in his area. "Someone who could read, could come and teach us ABC, we wrote the letters on the floor." Through these lessons he got some English skills and was selected to study in Kenya. "My time in Kenya was not easy, I didn't have money to pay my studies". He went back to Nuba Mountains and became a voluntary Primary SchoolTeacher. "Children are thirsty for education, they really run to people with knowledge, to learn at least something from them! This made me cry.." In the school he taught they were using a



Kenyan curriculum.
"In 2011 we were the best school in Nuba Mountains. I thank God for that! When I am a trained teacher, I can do even better!" In the future Tanabor hopes to build schools and to train others how to teach.
